



A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FIRE MARSHAL AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Spring Home Safety Checklist



- Check cleaning supplies. Look for leaking containers and dispose of what is no longer used or needed at a hazardous waste distribution centre.
- ☐ Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Replace batteries and test.
- Visually inspect electrical cords and outlets. Replace cords if worn or damaged.
 Contact a licensed electrical contractor to check loose-fitting outlets.
- Maintain air conditioner. Make an appointment with a qualified technician to perform safe and proper maintenance work for your specific unit.
- ☐ Clean eaves troughs thoroughly. Use a sturdy and reliable ladder and rubber gloves.
- Clean and check BBQ. Clean burner ports and tubes and test for hose leaks with a 50/50 water/soap solution.
- Store fuel and other combustibles outside. Keep them in a well-ventilated shed or detached garage and away from direct sunlight and other heat sources.
- Check recreational equipment.
 Make sure all playground equipment, bikes, skateboards, etc. are in safe working condition for family use.
- Call before you dig. Before starting a garden or outdoor home renovation, contact your local utility to quickly and easily get your underground utility lines marked to avoid pipeline damage.

With spring outdoor cleanup starting, we know some folks choose to burn brush and yard debris on their property. Cleaning up debris and limiting the level of flammable vegetation surrounding your home is a good practice. But make sure the way you do it is safe – for you, your home, your neighbors, and the surrounding area.

Open air burning can include the use of outdoor fireplaces and cooking fires not involving the use of a barbeque. Some outdoor appliances used are not recommended because there is potential for personal injury, property damage and increased risk of a grass fire.

Whether in the backyard of your home, the cottage or at a campground, make fire safety a priority. Open air burning, especially if left unattended, can become difficult to control and can result in a serious widespread fire."

A burn permit is required from April 1—October 31st at a cost of five dollars for the season.

An application can be filled out at the township office from Monday—Friday, 8:30 am until

4:00 pm. Residents are reminded that there is no burning allowed during the day!

Bill would like to thank everyone for taking the time to properly sort recycling materials. There has been a major improvement in a short period of time, making his job much easier.

There are a couple of reminders:

- Dog and cat food bags are not recyclable; they are to be put in the garbage;
- Plastic bags and overwrap are to be put inside one bag as a "bag in bag" system. The outer bag can be
 placed in with the paper/ cardboard or left separately in its own bag for pick up, but it does not belong
 in with the bottles and glass;
- Bulky materials (couches, mattresses etc.) are only accepted at the Bissett Creek disposal site;

Bag tags will be available for pick up at the office as of May 1st. If not picked up by June 5th they will be mailed out.

Please note the disposal sites will be closed on Saturday July 1st, 2017

A FRIENDLY MESSAGE FROM YOUR TREASURER...

Final tax bills will be mailed on or before July 10th. If you have not received your copy by July 20th, please contact the office to have it re-issued. This tax bill is broken up into two payments; the first installment is due July 31st and the second installment is due October 31st. If you wish to pay the full amount at once, you may do so.

With our new software, we have some new payment and eNotice options available to you.

New eNotice Option:

Instead of receiving your property tax bill by regular mail, sign up for **e-Notice**. Complete the e-Notice form on the municipal website (**townshipsofheadclaramaria.ca**) and return it to the municipal office. Once registered, you will automatically receive you property tax bills by email as soon as it is created. The service is **FREE** to you.

New payment options:

Credit card payments are now being accepted at the municipal office and on the township website for property taxes, tipping fees and building permits.

Please be advised: When making a credit card payment at the municipal office, there will be a convenience fee of 2.65% and a 3% fee for online payments.

We are now offering **pre-authorized debit payments** for property taxes **ONLY**. If you would like to register for this service, please submit a PAD Authorization form, along with a void cheque. Both forms are available on our website (**townshipsofheadclaramaria.ca**) or at the municipal office. You will receive an email notice that the payment will be automatically be withdrawn from your bank account. This is a **FREE** service available to you.

All previous payment options will continue to be available to you as well.

if you would like to make a donation to our *Homecoming Weekend Event*, please visit the municipal website and click on *Donation Link*. For all donations of \$10 or more, we will issue a *Charitable Tax Receipt* for you to claim on your next tax return. When making a donation to HCM, there will be no convenience fee.
