RESIGNATION OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL – NEED FOR REPLACEMENT

For those who may not have heard; in July Mayor Gibson and Councillor Grills resigned from Council. At a special meeting held July 20th , Council appointed Bob Reid to the position of Mayor of Head, Clara & Maria. Congratulations Mayor Reid, we look forward to you leading our council into the future.

In that same meeting, Council then directed staff to advertise for interested individuals to complete an application and submit to the Clerk if they are interested in being appointed to fill the seats left vacant.

At a second special meeting, to be held on Friday, September 1, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. in the Community Centre in Stonecliffe, Council will hear deputations from interested individuals and will select two to be appointed to Council for the remainder of this term. Those appointed will then be sworn in ready to assume their duties on Council. An orientation will be held at a date in September. If you are interested in one of these positions, please submit your application to the municipal office prior to close of business August 25th , 2017.

SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL – CP CORRIDOR AS MULTI-USE TRAIL THROUGHOUT HEAD, CLARA & MARIA

On Saturday, September 9, 2017 at 1:00 p.m. in the Community Centre in Stonecliffe, Council will hold a public meeting to hear from interested individuals on the use of the CP rail corridor throughout Head, Clara & Maria. This topic is complex and includes many components including: the ability of the County to dictate the use of property in a lower tier municipality; the erosion of private property rights; municipal liability where the trail crosses municipal roads; decisions and municipal/public consultation; types of use on the trail; short and long term costs to the municipality in upgrades and ongoing maintenance.

Over the past months, the local snowmobile club and its proponents have made its point of view known to Council. Council would like to and needs to hear from the larger community.

If you are interested in having your voice heard, please plan to attend this public meeting. If you are unable to attend, or prefer to have your say in a less public venue, please submit your concerns in writing to the municipal office at hmcclerkmreith@gmail.com or 15 Township Hall Road, Stonecliffe, Ontario, K0J 2K0. A public meeting mailer with additional details will be circulated in the next couple of weeks to provide background information.

A FRIENDLY MESSAGE FROM YOUR TREASURER...

The introduction of new tax classes caused delays in processing property tax bills.

Final tax bills have been mailed August 8th. If you have not received your copy by August 20th, please contact the office to have it re-issued. This tax bill is broken up into two payments; the first installment is due August 31st and the second installment is due October 31st. If you wish to pay the full amount at once, you may do so.

eNotice Option:

*Instead of receiving your property tax bill by regular mail, sign up for e-Notice. Complete the e-Notice form on the municipal website (townshipsofheadclaramaria.ca) and return it to the municipal office. Once registered, you will automatically receive your property tax bills by email as soon as it is created. The service is **FREE** to you.*

New payment options:

Credit card payments are now being accepted at the municipal office and on the township website for property taxes, tipping fees and building permits.

Please be advised: When making a credit card payment at the municipal office, there will be a convenience fee of 2.65% and a 3% fee for online and telephone payments.

*We are now offering **pre-authorized debit payments** for property taxes **ONLY**. If you would like to register for this service, please submit a PAD Authorization form, along with a void cheque. Both the PAD and eNotice forms are available on our website (townshipsofheadclaramaria.ca) or at the municipal office. You will receive an email notice that the payment will be automatically be withdrawn from your bank account. This is a **FREE** service available to you.*

All previous payment options will continue to be available to you as well.

A "So long"




A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FIRE
MARSHAL AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Important fire safety tips during power outages!

To reduce fire risk during a power outage, the Office of the Fire Marshal offers the following safety tips:

- Electrically-connected smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms will not work when the power is out unless they have battery back-ups. Make sure your home has battery-operated smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms. 
- Everyone should know how to get out immediately if there is a fire. Plan and practice your escape plan before emergencies happen.
- Use flashlights or battery-operated lanterns instead of candles or hurricane lamps. If using candles, place them in a secure holder and cover them with a glass chimney, away from children and pets. 
- Propane and charcoal barbecues are for outdoor use only. Do not bring them inside.
- Purchase generators with recognized approval labels. Make sure the unit has proper connection receptacles and circuit breakers.
- Portable generators should only be used outdoors and carefully located to ensure that exhaust fumes do not enter the home. Allow the generator to cool before refueling. Refuel the generator outside, following the manufacturer's instructions. Store fuel for the generator in approved containers, outside the home.
- Use only portable space heaters that have been designed for indoor use and follow the manufacturer's instructions. Provide adequate ventilation by opening a window slightly while the heater is in use. Before refueling, turn off the heater, wait for it to cool and take the heater outside to refuel.
- Make sure electric stove elements and small appliances are OFF or unplugged to prevent fires from occurring when the electricity is restored.
- Cordless phones will not work when the power is out, so it is recommended to have at least one phone that does not require electricity to operate. 

Use extreme caution during flood emergencies and power outages. Electrical equipment impacted by flood

Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogues & Household Paper

Old newspapers, magazines, catalogues and household paper, such as statements, bills and envelopes come back as fresh paper stock. They can also be made into products like boxboard, drywall, egg cartons, insulation and bedding trays.

Aluminum Containers

Aluminum can be recycled repeatedly, and most of the empties are typically melted, re-cast and refilled within 60 days. Recycling aluminum uses a tiny fraction of the energy it takes to refine ore from scratch—and aluminum can be used in everything from CDs to passenger jets.

PET Plastic Bottles

Lightweight Polyethylene Terephthalate (PET) plastic is infinitely recyclable and can be used to manufacture new bottles as well as items such as polar fleece, broadloom, rope, brush bristles, car bumpers and household furnishings.

Glass Bottles & Jars

As an infinitely recyclable material, the glass from bottles and jars can be used to make new glass containers. It also becomes a raw material for products like fiberglass insulation, high traction road surfaces and reflective signs, as well as construction aggregate.
