HCM Votes 2018 Municipal Elections

Polling stations for all communities will be open Monday October 22nd from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. at the municipal hall in Stoncliffe for the purpose of voting for the following positions:

Mayor—one to be elected at large

Councillor—four to be elected at large

All school board offices have been acclaimed.

Monday, October 22, 2018

10:00 a.m.—8:00 p.m.

There will not be a separate poll in Deux Rivières. One of the principals of the Elections Act is to maintain the integrity and secrecy of the vote. Based on the low numbers of residents who remain in the Deux Rivières poll, it is possible that after voting, the way people have voted may become known. For that reason, and due to logistics, the Deux Rivières

poll will be combined with that of Mackey. Bissett Creek's poll was combined with Stoncliffe years ago.

A person is eligible to vote at an election held in a local municipality if, on voting day, he or she:

- ◆ Resides in the local municipality or is the owner or tenant of the land there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant;
- ◆ Is a Canadian citizen;
- ◆ Is at least 18 years old; and
- ◆ Is not prohibited from voting under subsection 3 or otherwise by law.

Identification

You are required to bring and show photo ID to the Deputy Returning Officer in order to receive a ballot.

A table will be set up during the vote to make changes to the voter's list and/or endorse Proxy votes.



Floods

Flooding is a natural hazard in Ontario that can happen at any time of year.

Hazard Information

Floods are typically caused by melting snow, ice jams, heavy spring rains and summer thunderstorms. Flash flooding is caused by violent rain storms or breaking dams — often occurring with little or no warning. They can damage property and injure or kill people.

Safety Tips

If you are instructed by emergency officials to evacuate, do so immediately.

If you are indoors:

Move essential items (and household chemicals) to an upper floor

Disconnect electrical appliances — don't touch electrical equipment if you're wet or standing in water

Bring in outdoor furniture (if you have time)

Don't eat food that's come in contact with flood waters

If you are outdoors:

Move to higher ground if there is a chance of a flash flood

Don't walk through moving water — you may fall

If you have to walk — look for where the water is not moving and use a stick to check the ground in front of you

Keep children away from flood water

Don't drive through floodwaters



Prepare Now

Take the following steps so you and your family are prepared in the event of an emergency:

Put weather protection sealant around basement windows and ground-level doors

Install "check valves" in sewer traps to prevent floodwater from backing up into the drains of your home

Install the drainage for downspouts a sufficient distance from your home to ensure water moves away from the building

Move documents and keepsakes out of the basement

Keep instructions for shutting off gas and water valves handy and read them carefully

Let We Forget

W A S T E M A N A G E M E N T

Recycling materials must be sorted and put out at the curb in clear, plastic bags. Once at the site, the bags are opened and dumped into proper bins. Beauman Waste Management Systems Ltd. can only collect loose recycling.

Having the materials sorted properly when they are put out at the curb for pick up, will save our Disposal Site Attendant, Bill a lot of time (***and stress***) and in turn will save us money.

Residents can bring their own recycling to the landfill site during operating hours and dump loose recycling into the bins instead of using bags (if you prefer to do so). You cannot however, put loose recycling out for curbside collection, it must be in clear plastic bags.

A friendly reminder: Beauman **does not** accept Styrofoam or flower pots as recycling, it is to be put in with garbage.

Plastic bags do not go with commingled recycling. They are to be put in a “bag in bag system” and set aside or put in with your paper recycling.

We are only accepting bulky material (couches, mattresses etc.) at Bissett Creek disposal site.

It is important that fibre and commingled materials are properly sorted in order to make this program a success! If recycling materials are not sorted properly, a refusal sticker will be put on the bag with the reason, and proper sorting will have to take place before the material can be picked up.

Cooperation from everyone will create a successful program. It costs us money to landfill material. Let's work together to keep it out.



DUAL STREAM RECYCLING IN HEAD, CLARA AND MARIA

Commingled- tin cans, aluminum cans, paint cans (empty, open, and metal only—not plastic cans) pie plates, trays, foil wrap; clear and coloured glass food and beverage bottles and jars; plastic food and beverage containers: bottles, tubs and lids, milk and juice cartons, ice cream containers **rinsed and clean**

Fibre- newspaper, magazines, catalogues, flyers, junk mail; boxboard/ paperboard: cereal boxes, cracker boxes, tissue boxes, “paper” egg cartons, toilet paper/ paper towel rolls

Plastics- grocery and shopping bags. Outer wrap from water/pop cases, toilet paper and paper towels. Put all these items inside one bag—“bag in bag system”

Shredded Paper—
must be in separate clear bag



Head, Clara and Maria's Dual Stream Recycling program requires that fibres be separated from commingled material in clear plastic bags for curbside collection, or loose if residents wish to drop off their materials at the disposal site.

Please separate materials properly!

Items that are **not** recyclable:
Zippered plastic bags (usually for blankets or bed-in-a-bag sets), solar blankets, fiber glass feed bags, **Styrofoam of any kind**, bubble wrap, sponge foam, foam sheeting, hard cover books, plastic or metal strapping, picture frames, plastic with metal paint cans, hangers, oil containers, compost, glass or ceramic dishes, Tupperware, Rubbermaid, plastic toys, window pane glass and diapers.

Electronics, tires, scrap metal, clean wood/brush can be dropped off at the disposal site free of charge during regular operating hours.
